Corn Roast:

- no single use plastics bring your own utensils if you think you need them,
- for the treats, which we all love to contribute and eat, please cut them into finger foods sized portions to eliminate the need for utensils
- more condiments [©] and corn will be ordered this year, to avoid an uprising

PFDs (Personal Floatation Devices)::

- With the advancement in technology, there are now auto inflation PFDs that come with replacement cannisters.
- They can be expensive (in doing a quick check after the meeting, because expensive can mean different things to different people, the price range for self-inflatables is \$199+?).
- DO CHECK, as there are manual- inflatables that look very similar.

Fire Safety Committee:

- Weight of the fire pump: Can be handled by one person, but best to be two people to get it in and out of boats. Hose 2 lengths 100 feet, Pump stays on the dock. Gas motor.
- We are asking for **more volunteers to help respond to a fire emergency call.** be on the fire safety committee to help respond to a call and move the pump around
- Second pump would it be reachable by a vehicle? -this is something the fire safety committee would review as part of the practices, considering the time and accessibility issues
- Has there been discussion about more pumps? Start with one, see how it goes, proceed based on experience. Ultimately it could be 4, but decisions will be based on our experience.

Water Testing (cottage use water)

- Bottles for samples can retrieved and returned to the NK Township office
- Tuesdays 9-10,
- Test the water that you are drinking, especially if you are drinking lake water

Pet Owners:

- Scoop your pets poop, so it doesn't contribute to runoff into the water

Paul Smith, Park Superintendent:

- Brook the park biologist is quite active with a large number of studies
- ecological plan
- snake and skink study
- mature forest nocturnal owl studies
- alvars in the park
- vegetation and whippoorwill, turtles, snakes, on rock barrens,
- water quality studies,
- benthic monitoring studies now in 5 year cycles, monitored 5 creeks for comparison. Scoop and count insects. Compare to 2010, water quality is good.
- LDD (spongy moth) traps provincially, defoliation has decreased.
- Doug Wellman identified he is part of the Parks volunteers.
 - We could use a Loon Call Lake representative.
 - o Committee meets once a year to brainstorm what goes on in the park for programs
